

Dan Hunt

Dan Hunt has served as President of FC Dallas since 2014. He is a member of Major League Soccer's Board of Governors, serves on the league's Business Ventures Committee, and is Co-Chair of the Board of MLS NEXT Pro.

Hunt also served as chairman of Dallas' successful bid committee to secure nine matches for the FIFA World Cup 2026, the most among all 16 host cities. He will serve as Co-Chair of the North Texas FIFA World Cup Organizing Committee Board.

Hunt spent years working alongside his late father, American sports pioneer Lamar Hunt, on the design and construction of Toyota Stadium and Toyota Soccer Center. Since Toyota Stadium opened in 2005, Hunt has maximized the venue and surrounding facilities to help establish FC Dallas as a global leader in youth player development.

Toyota Soccer Center is a 145-acre, world-class soccer complex featuring 17 professional-grade fields and serves as the training home of FC Dallas, North Texas SC and the club's academy programs.

Hunt oversaw the successful negotiation with the City of Frisco on a \$200 million public-private renovation of Toyota Stadium, which began in early 2025. He also led the development of the \$58 million National Soccer Hall of Fame, which opened in 2018 and includes more than 70,000 square feet of renovated space, premium seating, locker rooms, hospitality areas and the National Soccer Hall of Fame Experience.

Outside of his executive responsibilities with FC Dallas, Hunt is an owner of the club and plays an active role in long-term strategic planning across the Hunt family's sports portfolio, including the NFL's Kansas City Chiefs. His involvement has included major facility initiatives, such as the 2010 renovation of Arrowhead Stadium.

In 2016, Hunt and Robert Casterline loaned their football card collection to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton, OH. Considered by many the most valued collection of football trading cards in the world, the collection includes rare complete sets, important rookie cards as well as informational displays which tell the story of American football and the hobby of card collecting.

Hunt began his business career in New York City as Vice President of New Business Development for Gemini Voice Solutions, a voice-over-internet-protocol provider.

A Dallas native, Hunt graduated from St. Mark's School of Texas and Southern Methodist University.
